

MUSEUMS AT THE RED FORT COMPLEX

A site Museum unlike other museums is built at a historical site. The objects are curated and displayed within The Red Fort, a monument from the 17th Century, that is a symbol of independent India. The museums have A/C's and a comfortable work environment This World Heritage site houses many museums. Students work at the Drishyakala museum, that has a collection of original artworks of renowned Indian artists, at the Swatantrata Sangram Sanghralaya, which provides a glimpse of major phases of India's struggle for freedom and at the Archaeological Museum. This programme will run from Tuesday 3rd June to Sunday 8th June 2025, from 9.00 am to 2.00 pm. Students report at the Red Fort. They work within the fort and museum premises, in groups, in pairs and individually. They are closely supervised by an ITIHAAS Team leader. Against the backdrop of the magnificent fort, they will create story boards, audio guides, activity kits for visitors. Explore the fort, beyond the obvious and study its architecture, with experts from ITIHAAS and A.S.I. They will meet professionals, archaeologists, curators, conservators and archivists. For the culmination they will curate a walk and take visitors around. A certificate will be given on successful completion of the programme.
